


Penny Paws Path to Wellness for Dogs

So You're Getting a New Puppy!?!?

If you're looking to adopt or purchase a new puppy, please schedule a consultation with one of our veterinarians to help you determine the perfect new family member for your lifestyle. There are many considerations to take such as breed, size, activity level, maintenance requirements, personality and individual behavioral issues.

Or, if you already have a puppy under your care here is an easy guide to help you raise a healthy and happy dog.



6-8 WEEKS

In the first exam, your Penny Paws veterinarian will provide a physical examination of your new family member, provide them necessary vaccinations and parasite control and answer any of your questions on how to best care for your new PUPPY!

VACCINATIONS

Distemper, Parvo shots

EXAMINATION

New Puppy xam

MICROCHIP

Insert the microchip and register your puppy's information

PARASITE CONTROL

Fecal exam, deworming, begin heartworm and flea prevention

SOCIALIZATION

No dog parks or other group functions until we have at least 2 rounds of vaccines on board

DIET

High quality "puppy" food- no table scraps and no cheap adult dog food

10-12 WEEKS

An appointment to the veterinarian should be scheduled for your puppy to get the next round of vaccines, deworming treatments and a fecal exam will also be administered to check for any parasites that are detrimental to your puppy's health.

VACCINATIONS

Distemper/Parvo virus, Kennel Cough, Leptospirosis

EXAMINATION

Puppy Progress Exam

DIET

High quality "puppy" food- no table scraps and no cheap adult dog food. Make sure your Puppy is growing!

PARASITE CONTROL

Fecal exam, deworming, continue heartworm and flea prevention

SOCIALIZATION

Start puppy classes

14-16 WEEKS

Please let your veterinarian know if you are having any difficulties with behavioral training, they will be able to help you find a specialist or a trainer. Also, start scheduling annual exams to keep your best friend healthy!

VACCINATIONS

Distemper/Parvo virus, Kennel Cough, Leptospirosis, Rabies

EXAMINATION

Puppy Progress Exam

DIET

High quality "puppy" food- no table scraps and no cheap adult dog food

PARASITE CONTROL

Fecal exam, deworming, continue heartworm and flea prevention

SOCIALIZATION

Continue puppy classes and find good dog parks to visit

STERILIZATION

Speak to your Penny Paws veterinarian about scheduling an appointment for neuter/spay surgery
